

19 JANUARY 2024: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

This week has seen the excitement of a dusting of rare Cornish snow at School. Although it melted fairly rapidly, it allowed pupils to have a bit of well-controlled “mini” snowballing before lessons began on Thursday. My thanks to our superb Estates and Facilities teams for all their work and long hours keeping the site gritted and safe during this cold snap.

We were delighted this week to formally unveil the Truro School Music Project, which will see the creation of a multi-million-pound music centre and refurbished multi-use Hall. Scheduled for completion at the start of 2026, it will create a hub for musical education and aspiration in Cornwall and will offer state-of-the-art facilities for pupils, the Truro Community, and beyond. From a pastoral perspective, the project also paves the way for improved facilities to support pupil well-being on site. You can read more about the project [here](#).

Over recent weeks and over the rest of this month, I have been speaking at Head of Year assemblies in the Lower and Middle Schools and focusing on the specific actions that pupils can take to build a culture of kindness in their own year groups and the wider School. Rev Helen has also been speaking in Chapel about the origins of the civil rights movement and ongoing challenges in society around discrimination.

This morning, I spoke to 1st Year pupils about the simple things that embed a culture of kindness: actively looking for ways to make someone’s day better, not worse; respecting and celebrating individual difference; using social media to build people up and not to put people down (despite the often poor role-modelling from public figures on social media), and to understand that each individual pupil is not superior to anyone, nor are they inferior to anyone. I reminded pupils of our QR code reporting tool which has now been in place since November, with posters across the School site, where they can report any concerns they have. I will be speaking to all year groups on this theme by the end of January.

It is worth reflecting too on the merits system within our revised Positive Behaviour and Values Policy. This year, I am delighted to say that pupils across the 1st to 5th Year have accrued 21,260 merits since September. All of these count towards the keenly fought House competition but, more importantly, each merit reflects the huge amount of hard work, imagination, kindness and creativity that our pupils demonstrate every day. Every merit is an achievement or contribution noticed, appreciated and celebrated by staff. Pupils achieve various levels of certificates ranging from a suitably Cornish Tin Award for 15 merits, through Bronze, Silver and Gold, right up to a Coronation Award for those who reach 150 merits. We are now awarding paper certificates in pastoral time for pupils when they achieve each award – do check whether a modest son or daughter has one (or a few) hidden in their school bag!

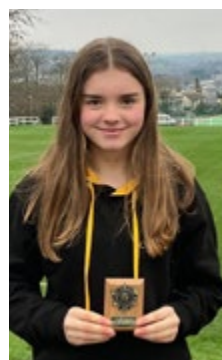

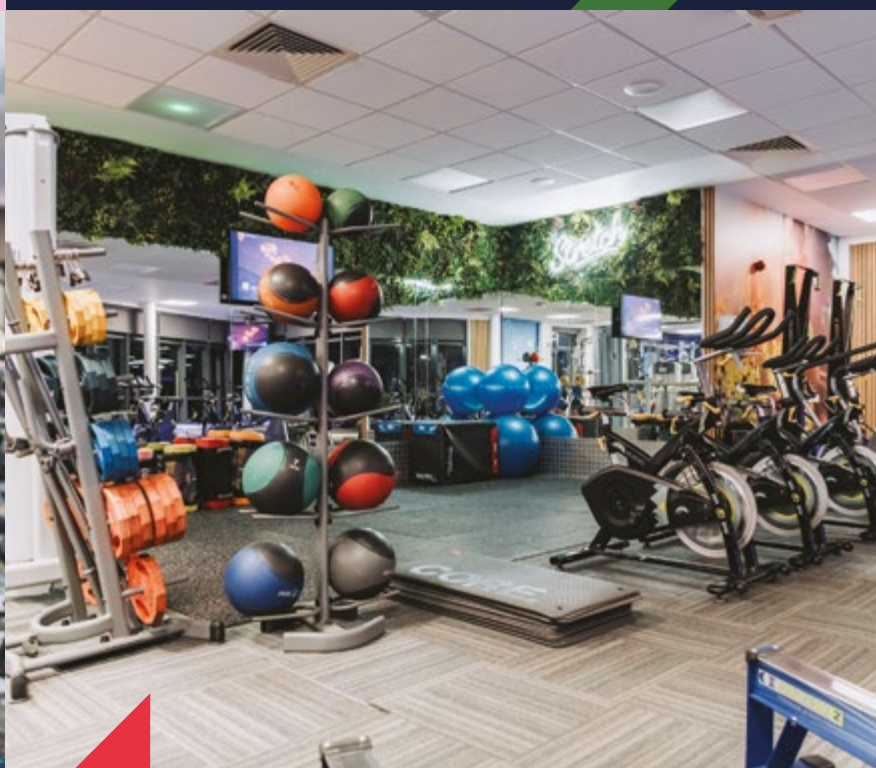

The Truro School Art Collection Goes On An Outing

ROYAL CORNWALL MUSEUM

In the early 1980s David Heseltine, then Head of Art at Truro School, found himself frustrated that the independent status of the school barred it from borrowing artworks from the Cornwall Council Schools Art Collection. He was convinced that the school should begin its own Collection in order that generations of students might learn from looking at the real thing. Today, the Collection encompasses nearly 300 artworks representing a veritable A-Z of late 20th and early 21st century artists, the majority of whom lived and worked in Cornwall and some of whom attained international recognition.

The Collection is rarely seen, and it is only the second time that the Collection has featured in an exhibition at the Royal Cornwall Museum in forty years. The exhibition draws from David's unique personal archive and anecdotal reminiscences that amplify the personal generosity of the many artists whom he visited in their studios who either gifted to the Collection or whom he purchased from.

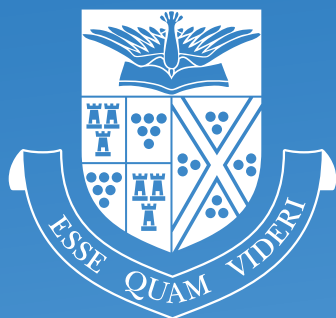




To access team sheets you should follow these steps:
