Dear Parents, Guardians, Carers,

This academic year our focus value is that of Courage – the strength to face challenges, overcome fears, and stand up for what is right, even when it's difficult. This week, the theme of courage has very visibly threaded throughout our school community.

During chapel this week, we looked at what it means to be an ally – listening to and learning about the experiences of others, and where necessary amplifying their voices and taking action to challenge prejudice. Mrs Holman, our Head of PSHEE, reminded us of the mosaic of cultures, religions and identities that make up our society and our school, and that everyone has the right to be treated with dignity and respect, regardless of their background or who they love.

Rev Helen reminded us that Jesus was an ally to many minorities; those who weren't being heard, who were misunderstood or were ignored or excluded and that it often takes courage to be an ally for someone. In this month of Pride, she encouraged us to find pride in ourselves, knowing that God loves us as we are and to be good allies to those in our LGBTQ+ community. We can all learn to be more aware of the language we use and have courage to create space to listen and learn.

The coverage of the 80th Anniversary of D-Day touched many of us this week. In our whole school assembly the Head challenged us to have the courage to look beyond ourselves when it matters – honouring and respecting those who 80 years ago put the future of their world, us, ahead of themselves. You will know as much as I do, that Truro School life is as busy as ever. After the brief respite of half term, public exams continue. Exams often take courage, and of course a bit of revision, but to those taking exams, know that we are wholeheartedly behind you and wish you all the best.

There have been so many wonderful sporting achievements across all the year groups – but a special shout out to all those involved in the Super 6 and Super 8 athletics teams, with some fantastic team and individual results. We have had trips aplenty - from the 4th Year Biology trip to Castle beach in Falmouth to the 2nd Year Geography trip to Godrevy, the Leiths trip to meet Nathan Outlaw in Port Isaac and Lower Sixth RS group, who visited Exeter University. We wish the courageous bronze D of E teams who are completing expeditions on the North Coast this weekend well – as well as those 2nd Years off further afield to Brittany. We also start to look forward to our Festival of Courage and recognise all the hard work and effort that is going on behind the scenes, pupils and staff alike, for all those events that will form part of those exciting two weeks at the end of term.

Finally, as we head into what is hopefully a sunny weekend, a brief reminder that Truro School is at the Royal Cornwall Show and we look forward to seeing many parents and friends at the stand (427) where we will be “celebrating music” and inviting all types of piano performers to join us – whether young or old, a beginner or an expert - all are welcome.

Marking D-Day 80

D-Day was the largest seaborne invasion in history and, alongside airborne operations, was the turning point towards the liberation of France and Western Europe in World War II. Assemblies allowed our pupils to reflect on the magnitude of this historic event. Mr Johnson talked of Cornwall and the South West's role in the landings, quoting a veteran from Plymouth, Bill Johnstone, who was 21 at the time of D-Day. He said, "You did what you had to do, and when the day arrived that was what it was like, and you did it."

Mr Johnson went on to reflect on the courage needed to face such adversity and asked, "When it truly matters for your friends, for our School, for the communities we are part of, or for the society in which we belong, do we individually and collectively have the courage to look beyond ourselves?"

2nd Years Trip to Gwithian

Our 2nd years made use of our enviable location in Cornwall as they visited Gwithian Beach to gain practical skills in their Geography studies in coastal processes. They measured beach profile data and completed field sketches, wave counts and longshore drift measurements.

This opportunity enabled them to experience physical fieldwork data collection for the first time. In their subsequent lessons, they have been producing their beach profiles and other data presentations, such as proportional flowlines. This has enabled them to work with the data collected and understand how to present and interpret the processes they have been learning about.
