European Day of Languages

This week, we celebrated European Language Week with great enthusiasm! Pupils from all year groups participated in a variety of language-based activities designed to enhance their understanding of different European cultures. It was wonderful to see so many pupils embrace the opportunity to explore new languages and be fully immersed in an assembly of different languages. Pupils have also been encouraged to create a poster illustrating the theme of Languages of Peace. Events like these not only broaden pupils' horizons but also develop their communication and problem-solving skills — both critical attributes in academic study and future employment.

Sixth Form Open Evening

On Tuesday, we hosted a successful Sixth Form Open Evening. It was a pleasure to welcome so many prospective pupils and their families. They had the opportunity to tour the facilities, meet subject teachers, and learn about the range of co-curricular opportunities available at Sixth Form level. Our current Sixth Formers also played a pivotal role in the evening, offering insights into how involvement in the co-curriculum and diploma has enriched their academic experience. Many pupils shared how leadership roles in clubs, participation in sports teams, and involvement in the arts have helped them manage time effectively, think critically, and work collaboratively—skills that will be invaluable in both higher education and the workplace.

The Value of Co-Curricular Involvement

The co-curriculum remains at the heart of our school's ethos, supporting pupils in their holistic development. Research, including findings from the Youth Sports Trust, continues to underline the strong link between co-curricular involvement and academic achievement. The survey revealed that nationally 72% of young people involved in sports and co-curricular activities feel more motivated in their studies, with 65% noting improvements in their mental health and well-being. These attributes—resilience, teamwork, leadership—are all highly valued by employers in the modern workforce. As we look to the future, ensuring our pupils build on these skills alongside their academic studies will remain a top priority. Please do chat to your child about how they use their time at lunchtime and after school and encourage them to get involved.

Our 1st Years have all been out on their teambuilding activities this week, which is a wonderful way to develop teamwork and camaraderie with their peers. Geography and Geology field work is also taking place, allowing the pupils to collect valuable data for their academic studies.

Looking Ahead

As we move further into the term, we are excited about more events, fixtures, performances and opportunities for our pupils. The school will continue to provide platforms where pupils can excel both inside and outside the classroom, and we encourage all pupils to take full advantage of what is on offer. Mr. Floyd Steadman OBE

This week, we had the privilege of hearing from the inspirational rugby legend and recently appointed Deputy Lieutenant of Cornwall, Floyd Steadman OBE.

He talked to all year groups about his remarkable life story, which included a candid account of his turbulent early family life, his experiences of social services and homelessness in London in the 1960s and overcoming discrimination and adversity in pursuit of studying A-Levels and his dream of becoming a teacher.



Floyd, a talented rugby player saw him rise through the ranks of his sport and made history as the first black captain of the Saracens, earning a place in the Rugby Hall of Fame. After fulfilling his dream of becoming a teacher, he advanced through the educational system, ultimately achieving positions as deputy headteacher and headmaster at several preparatory schools. In recognition of his contributions to rugby, education and charity he was honoured in 2023 with an OBE.

With his long-standing family roots in West Cornwall, his talk was insightful and thought-provoking. He stressed the need to continually challenge perceptions, break down barriers, and address unconscious bias without ourselves and our community. He left us with a sense of well-being, emphasising the importance of our values and responding to any situation with kindness and compassion.

Mr Murphy thanked Mr Steadman for sharing his inspiring story and encouraged pupils to speak to any member of the Safeguarding team regarding any topics discussed that may have impacted them. Additionally, he recommended that everyone read Mr. Steadman's book, *A Week One Summer*, available in the school library.

1st Year Footsteps of Discovery

This week, our 1st Years embarked on a day of team building in the stunning setting of Nantillio Woods, near Newquay. Held across two days, activities included developing rope and bushcraft skills, orienteering and code-breaking. Each day finished with an epic competition of 'Stand By', which required knot-tying and teamwork skills to win.

Run by Footsteps of Discovery, the days are a part of Truro School's structured induction programme into the Lower School.
