



Dear Parents, Guardians, Carers,

A huge well done to our whole school community for a fantastic first month back! The campus has been awash with enthusiasm for learning, with a strong focus on routines and learning behaviours to support everyone to enjoy a very positive start.

For new parents, and those who would like a refresher, I would like to take this opportunity to share one of the ways we support pupils to strengthen learning behaviours that support success at school and develop life-long learning skills.

At Truro School we encourage a growth mindset, shaped around our five Learning Scores; engagement, response to feedback, working with/alongside others, strategies for study, and homework. These are not measures of attainment but reflections of choices that individuals make about their approach to learning over time. Through highly effective learning and teaching strategies, teachers and tutors support pupils to take ownership of their learning and build positive learning behaviours. These same learning behaviours are also, of course, key to successful work in adult life too, where we also engage with complex tasks, receive feedback and seek to achieve in collaboration with others. It is never too early to build skills for a successful future! On page 9, Mrs Richards, our 1st – 5th Year Enrichment and Scholars Co-ordinator also explains why all learners should seek challenge and take risks in their learning.

This month, enacting change is a visible theme across our school. In Chapel, the Eco Team talked about our collective responsibility for sustainability and the environment. Mr Fraser shared the message that we all must do our part to look after our school community. Closing with the hymn 'All Things Bright and Beautiful' encouraged us to reflect on the importance of caring for the world and all within it.

October is Black History Month, carrying the powerful theme 'Reclaiming Narratives', through which we are reminded through stories and the experiences of many, of the injustices faced by people all over the world. In Whole School Assembly this week Mr Johnson invited us to reflect on the life of Joseph Emidy, a black man born in West Africa and enslaved on plantations in Brazil. Following his enslavement, Joseph arrived in Cornwall and, as a talented violinist, led the Truro Philharmonic Orchestra. Joseph's courageous and inspirational life is commemorated in Truro Cathedral and is an important reminder that stories are powerful tools with the capacity to share and shape experiences. Throughout Black History Month our pupils will have the opportunity to engage in assemblies, activities and discussions that invite a broader understanding of the world and our role in enacting change.

Finally, we look forward to our Open Morning this Saturday where our wonderful pupils and colleagues will showcase our fantastic school. In a month where we are reminded of our shared responsibility to educate ourselves and others, we begin by shining a light on the positive role models in our own school community.

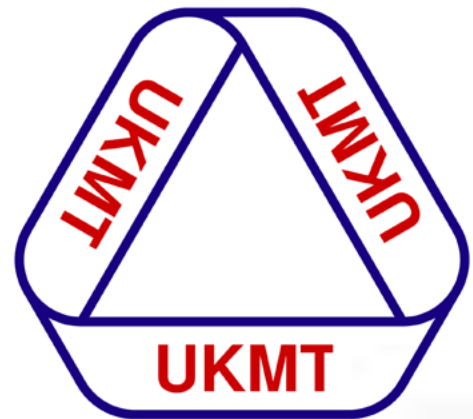


Senior Maths Challenge

A large cohort of our Maths students took part in the UKMT Senior Mathematics Challenge, a prestigious national competition designed to test advanced problem-solving skills and mathematical reasoning. The challenge, open to students in Year 13 and below, presents a series of complex, non-routine questions that require creativity and deep mathematical thinking.

This year, we entered students from both Lower Sixth and Upper Sixth, in addition to two highly capable pupils from the 4th Year and one from the 5th Year. Each demonstrating keen mathematical aptitude and a willingness to engage with the demanding nature of the challenge.

We are now eagerly awaiting the results, which will determine how they performed. We are hopeful that some may qualify for the follow-on rounds, including the Senior Kangaroo or the British Mathematical Olympiad, both of which are designed for the highest achievers from the initial competition. These rounds provide further opportunities for our students to engage with advanced mathematical problems and showcase their talents on a national stage. We will keep you posted!

Celebrating Rosh Hashanah

This week across the Senior and Prep sites we have been acknowledging Jewish New Year as Jewish people within our community enter into Rosh Hashanah.

Rosh Hashanah is an opportunity to turn back to God and make a fresh start – looking forward in hope to the year ahead. A Jewish custom is to dip apples in honey and eat them while thinking about what sweet things are hoped for in the coming year. During Rosh Hashanah a horn called a Shofar may be heard as a call for repentance (to turn away from things that are causing harm, rather than doing good). Rev Helen, joined by Mr Berger, invited our Senior School pupils to dip a piece of apple in honey and think about what sweet things they hope for the world and what they can do to help realise that hope.



Boscastle and the Valency Valley

Our 5th Year Geography classes visited Boscastle and the Valency Valley in North Cornwall this week as part of their GCSE fieldwork. Here, they measured the river at different points to assess width, depth, velocity, and discharge. They also created field sketches of flood management schemes. Pupils demonstrated great initiative by using their mobile phones as clinometers and recording devices to assist with their investigations and analyses.

The 5th Years exhibited exemplary behaviour, and members of the public remarked on how well they worked together as a team to carry out their research. Congratulations to everyone for their focus and hard work during this valuable learning experience.

This term sees the launch of our Enrichment guides for Lower and Middle School written to support all pupils in their quest to be curious.

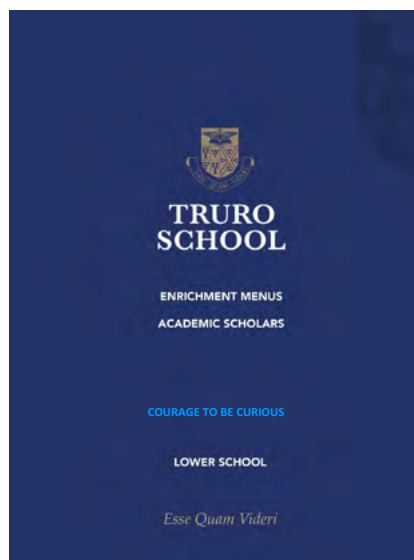
All of our children can and should be scholarly in their approach to learning, taking academic risks and looking for opportunities to be curious.
