This is an exceptional honour, as the BMO is a highly competitive and challenging exam, part of the selection process for the UK International Mathematical Olympiad team. Only around 1,600 children nationwide are invited to participate, making Sarang's qualification a rare and significant achievement. We offer him our heartfelt congratulations!

Students from our Sixth Form were joined in The Burrell by guest speaker Fiona Dorman to attend a Colour Me Foundation Workshop.

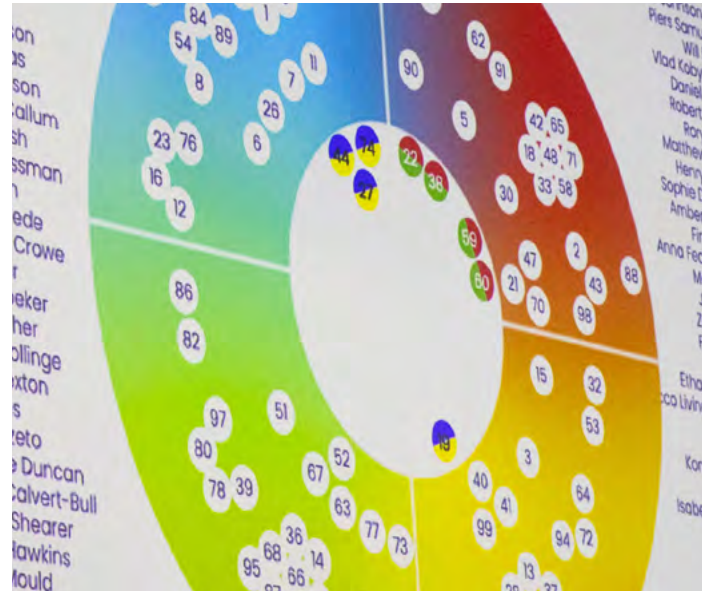
This interesting session is aimed at assisting students to find strengths and weaknesses in their behaviours as they prepare for university applications and career decisions.

Each student had pre-filled in a series of questions to determine their behavioural traits as well as answering group session questions on the day. The answers formed their individual behavioural colour. This offers each student an interesting and illuminating profile to capture how they do things and how their behaviour interacts with other peoples. Using the information can help to see the areas where they are more confident and comfortable, it can assist in career choices, as it highlights sectors of industry that may suit and also with university interview questions such as – what are your strengths?

Fiona has collated the profiles of each student, which offer of 56,000 different combinations, and interestingly Truro School Sixth Form has a vary varied result. Students are represented across the board, within each colour. In educational establishments this can be very rare as students can often feel they have to behave a certain way. This is a very positive outcome for our school, as its shows that students are allowed to express their own behaviours and be who they want to be. We also have many students in the red area, showing high levels of confidence amongst the group.

Students have been conversing amongst their peers to identify their colour and present to the group – some had very interesting results, learning new information about themselves and their cohort.

Boarders: Baking and Aquarium

Malvern House celebrated Lea's birthday with a fun 'muffin bake-off,' featuring innovative flavours such as apple crumble, matcha tea, and vegan white chocolate with raspberry. They also dedicated time to their Boarders' PSHEE program. It was wonderful to see everyone collaborating and engaging in these important conversations.

Over the weekend, the boarding houses enjoyed a combined trip to the Newquay Aquarium, where they took an underwater journey through the Blue Reef Aquarium. Some attended an informative talk on sharks and explored various tanks and exhibits, including looking at eel grass habitats for seahorses and one particularly curious octopus.



3rd Year Geography Fieldtrip

On the 3rd and 4th of October, our entire 3rd year cohort travelled to the River Kenwyn drainage basin. This year group are the first geographers to complete a fieldwork study in each of their Key Stage Years (1st to 3rd Year), which will stand them in excellent stead for their GCSE years.

With the sun shining and blue skies, our pupils were split into small groups of 8 led by a member of staff, to allow a deeper level of engagement and study.

We were very proud and pleased with their enthusiasm for their work.

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Drone Technology for WAA Physics Club

The WAA Physics Club enjoyed a fascinating afternoon discussing drones with a visit from Mr. Moss of RNAS Culdrose. Royal Naval Air Station Culdrose is the home base for the Merlin Helicopter Force, the Royal Navy's anti-submarine unit, and Squadron 700X.

All pupils were highly engaged, asking many questions that sparked conversations about how drones are adapted for flight on Mars where atmospheric density is extremely low. They also explored the use of drones in mountain rescue services and were fascinated to learn all about the sport of drone racing.

A big thank you to Mr Moss and RNAS Culdrose for an insightful afternoon and for sharing their technology with us.

Sixth Form Synthesise Aspirin

Sixth Form chemistry students have been progressing through their organic chemistry syllabus and today focused on synthesising aspirin through the reaction of salicylic acid (2-hydroxybenzoic acid) and ethanoic anhydride. This experiment is a key component of their practical endorsement. They employed a Buchner Funnel for vacuum filtration to isolate the crystals formed during the reaction.



WAA Horse Riding Skills

Our WAA horse riding group have been enjoying some time in the sand school, where they have been focussing on their rising trot and canter. They also enjoyed some jumping, adding an exciting dimension to their equestrian skills.

It is lovely to see the riders' compassion for the sport and the confidence they're gaining each week.

Our very popular WAA surfing groups have been enjoying some fantastic surf conditions along the North Coast of Cornwall over recent weeks. With consistent swells and favourable weather conditions, surfers of all skill levels have been taking advantage of the excellent waves.

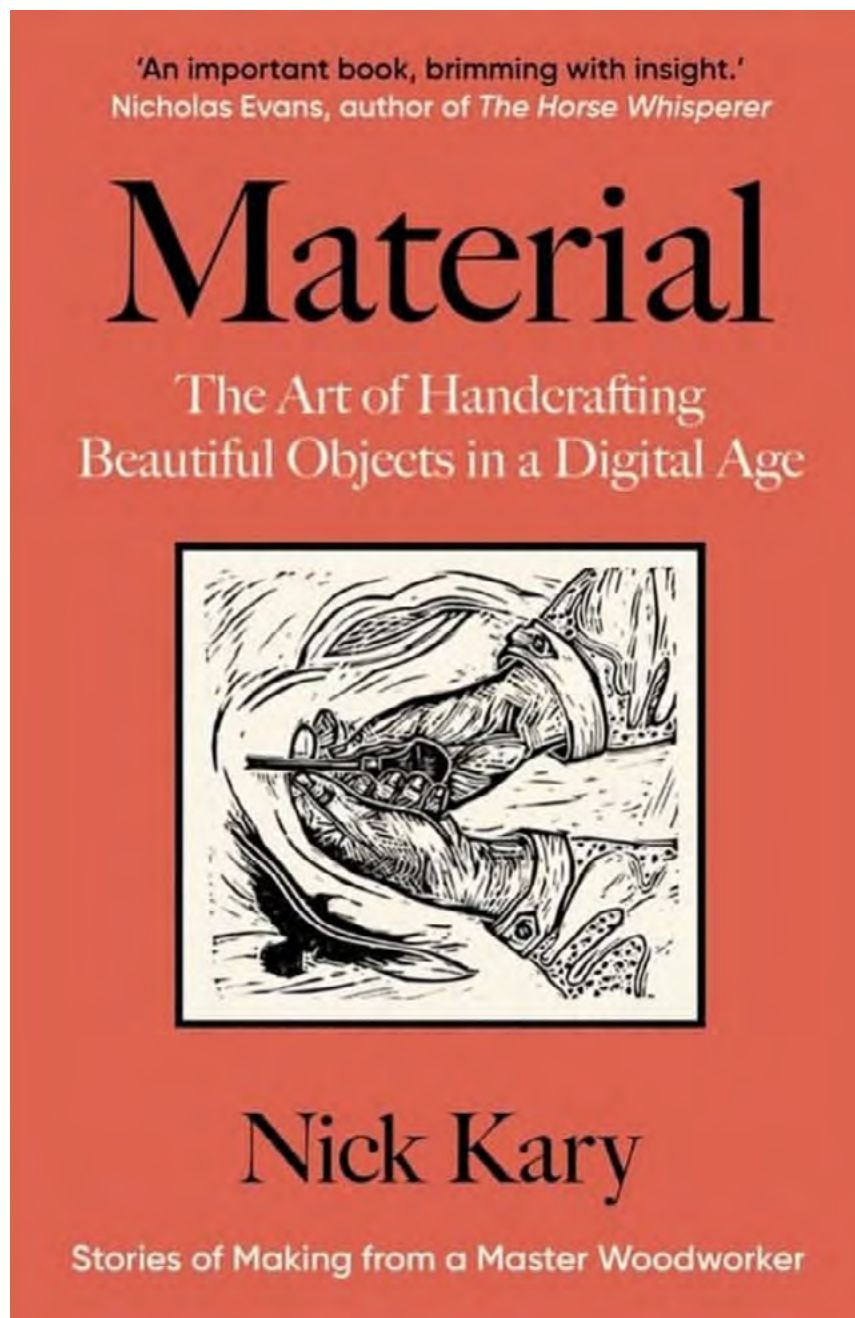
