

Successful Girls on Board Training

It was a pleasure to host Andrew Hampton, author of Girls on Board and Working with Boys, for a special training event aimed at empowering staff from both Truro School Senior and Prep alongside other local schools. The session introduced attendees to the principles of Hampton's innovative approach, designed to help girls resolve friendship issues independently. This is one part of a wider PSHEE curriculum that also draws on intervention from the Working With Boys programme that enables to support all pupils in our community and care.





Staff had the opportunity to become certified Girls on Board Champions, gaining insight into how the program supports girls aged 7 to 18 in navigating complex social dynamics. Selected pupils from Truro School participated in the training, offering invaluable contributions throughout the sessions which builds on the rolling out of the programme into the wider year groups.

Girls on Board has already been adopted by over 1,000 schools worldwide, supporting tens of thousands of girls in their friendships. The award-winning approach has garnered media attention, including features on BBC Radio Five Live and in the TES.



Celebrating Black History Month

Black History Month is celebrated every October in the UK, honouring the history, achievements, and contributions of people with African and Caribbean heritage. Recently, we had the privilege of hearing from Floyd Steadman at both the Senior and the Prep School, and pupils have explored Black writers, artists, and storytellers with a catalogue of work curated in our library BLACK HISTORY MONTH – Truro School Library – LibGuides at Truro School and reading recommendations showcased on our library tree.



This year's theme is 'Reclaiming Narratives.' The Sixth Form team held an assembly focused on this theme, emphasising the importance of challenging inaccuracies in historical narratives. Mrs Jupp highlighted the story of Rosa Parks, who in Alabama, USA in 1955, famously refused to give up her seat on a bus, sparking a 381-day boycott of the bus service. This pivotal act led to significant changes in the laws governing public transportation for Black and white individuals.



Additionally, they spoke about Ncuti Gatwa, the first Black actor to portray the Doctor in "Doctor Who". Gatwa's casting represents a significant milestone in the show's history and conveys a powerful message: 'anyone can be the Doctor.' For him it is more than a role, its about reshaping the narrative of 'who gets to be the hero' and expanding the possibilities for the next generation. His first name is pronounced 'N-Shoo-Tee' and by getting names right we can honour each person's narrative and contribute to a more inclusive environment.

Everyone has been encouraged to visit the library and online portal (with links to Kresen Kernow), immerse themselves in Black history and take the time to explore narratives of the past and present. Thank you to everyone in our community who has contributed to an inspiring start to Black History Month.


Senior Sports Round Up 18.10.24

after a well-deserved win against St Ives School. A great display of teamwork and skill – well done, boys!


U14 Netball Triumph

In a nail-biting mixed-age boys' game against Penryn College U16s, both teams battled hard in a 5-5 draw. Well done to all involved!




Clara G-D Fencing Achievements


